ELG: Creating with Materials

Safely use and explore a variety of materials. tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.

Share their creations. explaining the process they have used.

Make use of props and materials when role playing characters in narratives and stories.

AU1: Who do you think you are?

Children will learn the skills to use crayons, felt tips, pencil, chalk and paint. They will explore colour and line through adult led/whole class inputs.

They will make representations of themselves using loose parts, drawing and painting. The children will learn how to safely use scissors in their play.

The role play area will be set up as a home where the children will be encouraged to take on roles that

are familiar to them e.g. mum/dad/nanny





AU2: Our school and local environment

The children will use the local area to make collections of natural objects. They will study Andy Goldsworthy art and create their own designs.

The children will create 3D landscape art with their collections from the local woodlands. They will also be designing, creating and painting woodland animal sculptures using clay.

SP1: Who is your hero?

The construction and block play area will contain images to copy and create. The children will be encouraged to improve and develop their creations and explain how they made them. The children will be introduced to the words sculpture and architecture.





The children will learn how to thread, join, cut and fold at the creative area.

Future learning in Year 1 **DRAWING**

To use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas. experiences and imagination.
